1. Explain why the program is being discontinued.

Despite the fact that Africana Studies is efficiently administered through sharing resources within Interdisciplinary Studies, cross listing courses from existing faculty, teaching courses through DE, having high course enrollments, and contributing significantly to general education requirements in Humanities, Global Knowledge, US Diversity, and Interdisciplinary Perspectives, the program has a small numbers of undergraduate majors and graduates. As a result, NC State recommends that the bachelor's degree be discontinued because of long-term and persistent low enrollment and very few degrees awarded and the fact that the program is highly unlikely to grow sufficiently to have a critical mass of students.

2. If the program addresses high priority needs, how will those needs be addressed by other programs?

We are recommending that three programs (050201 Africana Studies, 050207 Womens and Gender Studies and 240101 Interdisciplinary Studies) being consolidated as three concentrations (Womens and Gender Studies, Africana Studies, Individual Studies) within the existing Interdisciplinary Studies (CIP 240101) major at NC State. We will discontinue the Africana Studies degree. Existing students will be

transferred to the IDS degree and complete their work within the newly established concentration.

3. Describe steps to be taken to allow students enrolled in the program to complete their courses of study.

Students in the present BA in Africana Studies will be offered the choice of continuing in the program and earning the degree or switching to the new concentration within the existing Interdisciplinary Studies (CIP 240101) major. NC State will officially discontinue the program when all continuing students have been graduated or have otherwise left the program. The university will cease accepting applications for the BA in Africana Studies at the beginning of spring semester 2015. Applications already submitted will be transferred to the concentration, and the director of Africana Studies will notify those applicants of the change in physiology education. The initial enrollment of students in the concentration will be in fall semester 2015.
