WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

- **Remarks from Chair Elect Marta Klesath-** Welcomed the committee members introduced guests.
- **Remarks and Updates from OUCCAS/DASA-** Li Marcus reminded the members that the last UCCC meeting will be November 29, 2017 and the final CUE meeting will be December 1, 2017. All actions coming to these meetings must be at the OUCC Review step by November 15, 2017.
- **Approval of the Minutes from October 25th 2017 – Approved Unanimously**
 - Discussion: Member Walter Robinson moved to approve. Minutes from the previous meeting were presented and approved without further discussion.

NEW BUSINESS

- **Consent Agenda -Approved Unanimously**
(BUS 459, ET 240, ET 484, FLS 395, HESM 328, HI 307, HI 321, HI 322, HI 338, HI 341, HI 370, HI 374, HI 381, USC 101, USC102)
Discussion: Member Andres Orphanides moved to approve.
- **HESF 113 High Intensity Conditioning-Approved Unanimously**
Discussion: Member Amanda Beller presented the course. Member asked about the attendance policy stating five absences are okay, but after the sixth absence a student would fail the course. Presenter responded that this is standard for these 1 hour health exercise studies courses.
- **MUS 135 Symphonic Band -Approved Pending**
Discussion: Member Amanda Beller presented the course. Member asked if the attendance policy doesn't refer to the University attendance policy on excused vs. unexcused absences. Members asked if not having the incomplete course grade option is okay, Li Marcus explained this is up to the instructor. Member Scott Despain moved to change the motion to approved pending the inclusion of the link to the university attendance policy, members voted to change the motion. Approved pending the inclusion of the link to the university attendance policy.
- **MUS 370 Intermediate Songwriting using Digital Audio Workstations –Approved Unanimously**
Discussion: Member Beth Fath presented the course.
- **CNR 295 Special Topics in College of Natural Resources –Approved Unanimously**
Discussion: Member Edwin Lindsay presented the course. Member asked about the process for special topics courses, Li Marcus explained the inclusion of the sample syllabus is part of the process in approving a course to include letter grading as an available grading method.
- **ET 255 Hydro, Wind, and Bioenergy Assessment -Approved Pending**
Discussion: Member Ewin Lindsay presented the course. Member suggested the abbreviated title could be the full title if the instructor would like, presenter replied this will likely not be a problem with the instructor. Member asked about the expected enrollment in the DELTA/Online Enrollment in CIM, guest Elizabeth Nicholas responded 20-30 students enrolled. Member suggested changing the description grammar indicating "either" would be between 2 instead of 3 choices. Member said the addition of the attendance policy is needed in the syllabus. Member asked about the

attendance policy indicating “students may be asked to provide documentation” about excused absences. Guest responded this will likely be irrelevant for this course being an online course and explained quizzes and other assignments have a window of multiple days to complete assignments. Member Scott Despain motioned to change the motion from Approved to Approved Pending. Member indicated a rounding statement would be beneficial for the grading scale. Approved Pending the inclusion of the attendance policy link and a rounding statement for the grading scale. Friendly suggestion to adjust the grammar in the description.

➤ **Renewable Energy Assessment Certificate 15REACTU-Approved Pending**

Discussion: Member Edwin Lindsay presented the curricular action. Member asked if the elective courses should include additional courses outside of the ones outlined. Guest Elizabeth Nicholas responded that these courses are already approved and the only ones being changed are courses that are being combined. Guest indicated in the future they would potentially add an additional engineering elective. Chair and Li Marcus reminded the committee that the courses are generally decided by the college, therefore a suggestion, simply for consideration, would be appropriate. Guest indicated the certificate curricula should indicate that there are 4 required courses, ET 120, ET 262, and either ES 300, ET 220, and ET 255. Member asked about the enrollment in the certificate moving from 25 to 50 students and if the required courses could Guest indicated ES 300 is a requirement for many of the enrolled students who are generally environmental science. Member asked if ES 300 is an elective being added and guest responded yes, students will choose 2 of the 3 elective courses to total 4 courses. Approved pending the exclusion of ET 240 and inclusion of ES 300 to the electives list.

Discussion: Member Edwin Lindsay presented the curricular action.

Re: Adding a course to the Minor in Chinese Studies

This is to request a change to the course listing for the Minor in Chinese Studies. A course in Modern Chinese Popular Culture [FLC 351] was recently added to the curriculum and the department would like to add it to the information for the Minor in Chinese Studies under the category "And one (1) of the following courses."

Thank you for your consideration.

Chinese Studies (16CIM)

Description

Students majoring in any area of study at NC State are eligible to minor in Chinese Studies. The minor cannot be in the same discipline as the major. The minor in Chinese Studies will provide students with an opportunity to round out their study of Chinese language, culture, and political thought. An investigation of the significance of Modern Asia forms an important complement to studies in Economics, Political Science, History, and Multi-disciplinary Studies. Students may declare the minor when they are enrolled in a class that counts toward the minor.

At the completion of the minor the student will:

1. Be able to communicate using the basic skills of modern standard Chinese,
2. Have some familiarity with Chinese culture, literature and political thought and
3. Have a general overview of China's political and religious institutions and the role of China in Southeast Asia.

Requirements

- Completion of 15 credit hours is required.
- 9 Credit hours must be taken at NC State and a maximum of six (6) credit hours may be transferred into the minor from another institution.
- The Department of Foreign Languages and Literature will determine which courses transferred from other institutions may qualify to meet requirements for the minor.
- A grade of 'C-' or better is required in all courses in the minor program
- A maximum of TWO (2) course may be used (double-counted) towards both departmental major requirements and minor requirements.
- No courses for the minor may be taken for S/U credit.

Students may declare the minor when they are enrolled in a class that counts toward the minor.

Ethics (16ETHM)

Description

Ethical issues arise in every field of human endeavor, so knowledge of ethics is beneficial to students regardless of their major. The Minor in Ethics is designed to expose students in a systematic way to the fundamental theories and concepts of ethics. It is a highly desirable minor because it demonstrates to employers, graduate schools, and professional schools an interest in and knowledge of ethical issues.

In addition to taking a solid core of philosophy courses focusing on ethics, students pursuing the minor may also elect to count towards it one relevant course from another department. This course will be chosen from a list of courses offered by a wide range of other departments including Anthropology, Engineering, Genetics, History, Microbiology, Political Science, and the Science, Technology, & Society Program.

Requirements

- The minor consists of 15 hours of credit (5 courses) including 6 hours of required courses and 9 hours of elective courses.
- A grade of 'C-' or better will be required for all courses taken to fulfill the minor requirements.
- A maximum of TWO (2) courses may be used (double-counted) towards both departmental major requirements and minor requirements.

The department will determine whether courses which have been transferred from other institutions qualify for the minor. No more than two courses from other institutions may count toward the minor.

All students must take FLx 201 and 202 in their chosen language; plus a minimum of 9 hours of upper level language courses; plus a 3-hour literature course; plus a 3-hour senior seminar (FL 492); plus a minimum of 6 hours of upper level Asian studies courses which must include at least one 400-level course. (All students must take an NCSU Proficiency Test upon entering H&SS. Students who take FL 101 will not receive graduation credit unless it is in a language other than the one used to fulfill the 401 requirement for the major). A grade of C or above is required for these courses to count toward the major.
2. **Asian Studies Electives:** (9) hours required, including at least 6 hours of upper level Asian studies courses and 3 hours of general Asian studies courses. These will be chosen in consultation with the student's advisor, and may include instruction in a second Asian language as deemed appropriate. A grade of C- or above is required for these courses to count toward the major.
3. **History I:** One 3-credit course is required. A 200-level survey course covering a culture significantly different from our own, i.e., pre-industrial or non-Western. . Choose from the list of courses currently approved by the college.
4. **History II:** One 3-credit course is required. A 200-level survey course covering our own or a similar culture (U.S., Western, or industrial-era). . Choose from the list of courses currently approved by the college.
5. **Literature I:** One 3-credit course is required. A survey course covering literature outside the U.S. and prior to the 20th century. Choose from the list of courses currently approved by the college.
6. **Literature II:** This requirement is satisfied by the Upper-level Asian Literature Course required in the Asian Language core in the major.
7. **Social Sciences:** Four 3-credit courses are required (12 credit hours total) from the H&SS-approved lists in at least three of the following areas: ANT, ARE, EC, PS, PSY, SOC. Also ENG 210, GEO/SOC 220, or STS 402. Six (6) credit hours must be chosen from the GEP Social Sciences list.
8. **Philosophy:** One 3-credit course is required. Choose any PHI course from the GEP-Humanities List.
9. **Arts and Letters:** One course is required from the H&SS-approved Arts & Letters course list.
10. **Free Electives:** Any course except MA 101. FL 101 courses can be used only if they are in a different language from the major and different from the language in which the student passed an NCSU Proficiency Test upon entering H&SS.



1. Statement of justification

The proposed change allows one more 300-level HI course in the Major Electives, as an option. This will allow our majors to explore concentration areas, to have some topical or regional preparation for a 400-level course, and to take advantage of our growing number of 300-level course offerings. An additional transitional course between 200-level and 400-level can improve the skills and background for research- and writing-intensive advanced courses. It remains an option, because we do have students ready for early and more 400-level courses than the degree requires (proposed 9 hours plus the capstone HI 491 seminar).

No change is proposed in requirements for History BA – Teacher Education Concentration.



1. Statement of justification

The proposed change allows any two broad geotemporal survey courses (HI 200-level). The current curriculum parallels the narrower History I & II requirements for College of Humanities & Social Sciences majors. The proposed change will have no effect on students with majors in Humanities & Social Sciences, as they take History I and II. The change will allow a broader range of other majors across the University to minor in History, by making the introductory course grouping more consistent with introductory HI courses fulfilling University GEP-Humanities.

No change is proposed in requirements for the 12 credit hours of advanced Electives in History.

In parallel with requirements in the History major that limit Transfer credits (12 out of 30 hours), the Minor would limit Transfer credits to 6 hours (out of 18).

History (16HIM)

Description

The minor in History is flexible in that it can provide depth to a variety of majors by granting a larger historical understanding of a subject. Thus students majoring in political science but with a special interest in the Middle East or Europe can gain a much deeper understanding of how events in the past have shaped present dilemmas. Likewise, those wishing to attend law school can choose from a range of courses in legal history. You can tailor the minor to suit your individual interests. History courses teach not only background, but methods of research, analysis, and writing. No courses for the minor may be taken for S/U credit.

Still, students should check with the advisor no later than the pre-registration period for the student's final semester at NC State to make sure they are not missing any courses for the minor.
