Discussion: "Disciplinary Distinction" in UG minors and certificates

Li shared the informational Disciplinary Distinction in UG Minors and Certificates document and walked the committee through a few of the sections before opening up the floor for committee discussion and brainstorming. Committee members discussed various elements, including definitions for terms such as "extra effort" and asked questions pertaining to what constitutes non-distinctions versus degree requirements. Concerns were raised pertaining to crossover being too close and too much dual-counting reducing the level of distinction between qualifications and qualification levels (minors, certificates, and degree concentrations). Other questions include but are not limited to:

- Is interdisciplinary (non) distinction a value as well?
- What is the prevalence of students trying to get a degree and a minor (or certificate) in the same field? What is their [the students'] reasoning for doing that?
- Is there a real-world use case where such a thing is "needed" or valued?

Chair encouraged the committee to discuss this topic more broadly with their respective units.
