New business:

 - b. Either they or the chair will post the questions to an online survey that allows repeated entries from the same device (so each committee member can conduct multiple surveys off a single device of their choice).
 - c. The chair will distribute the exact charge to the committee and survey link when available.
- 4. Shawn and Lisa described opportunities for committee members to attend upcoming Dining events as well as the option for carryout from cafeterias. Lisa dispensed tokens for reusable takeout containers.

Old business:

 Update on the graduate student project at Talley SC: Bernie Hansen related that the students have nearly finished collecting baseline data (compost weight vs gross sales) and are in the process of final design and approval of signage designed to improve compliance.
