The sub-committee worked with UCC Service Learning Subcommittee on the shared mission. The results are as following:

As a result of our subcommittee presentation to the UCCC on Jan 18, 2015, a follow-up meeting between our two subcommittees was scheduled for September 2015 but it was cancelled.

"Possible Service Learning Courses": in December 2015, UCCC Service Learning Subcommittee continued with the task to provide a report to UCCC indicating which courses the subcommittee thinks merit approval for the Service Learning attribute and document the findings.

UCCC Service Learning Check Sheet serves to inform those who are interested in generating a course that will be considered for the SVL attribute and also is intended for reviewers on the department, college and university committees to help determine if the course does qualify for the SVL attribute.

February 2016, UCCC Service Learning Subcommittee met after UCCC meeting and moved forward with the task.

April 2016, Mike Mullen, the VC and Dean for DASA, verbally confirmed that the Service Learning classes should be ready for a release in Fall 2016 but they will not be part of required courses for graduation.
