**II. Internationalizing the Tenure Code (Dr. Bailian Li)**

- This is becoming a mainstream topic and CIP has been working towards these efforts for a long time. The American Council on Education (ACE) collected data and put together a guide for all universities to think about implementing at their own institutions. - It was suggested CIP takes this on as a major initiative in the near future. We are in a good position to move forward with this now and could have a significant impact on internationalizing the university.
- Action items: Review the ACE document (whole committee) and revisit past committee efforts (OIA).

**III. NC Japan Center Presentation (John Baugh, Director)**

- The center is located in a historic home adjacent to Centennial Campus and established in 1980 by Governor Hunt.
- Services include promoting business ties with Japan, fostering academic collaboration and serving the general public.

- Achievements include a well-established art program, an extensive language program, disaster recovery efforts and helping to recruit Japanese businesses to the triangle area.
- Additional services, academic information and staff can be found in the attached presentation.
- Discussion:
  - Japan Center routinely collaborates with the College of Humanities and Social Sciences, among others. Contact John if you would like to discuss other collaborative opportunities.
  - NC State has a strong strategic partnership with Nagoya University in Japan, among other institutions there. Student mobility between our countries has been down recently.
  - A growing amount of universities in Japan are offering courses in English as well as scholarships for American students to study in Japan.

#### IV. **Sub-committee Progress Update**

- College Inventories
  - Marc Hoit (Vice Chancellor for IT & CIO) has been in contact with Rudi about creating a university-wide database based on college inventories of international collaboration. Marc is interested in scaling up the new CALS database to the larger university community and will be invited to a CIP meeting in the spring.
  - The sub-committee is working with Jose Cisneros in CALS to learn about the CALS process, costs, technical specifications, etc.
  - The committee recommends that we invite the Provost to a meeting in May to present a proposal directly to him. This could also be a good opportunity to propose adjustments to the tenure-code regarding internationalization.
  - Internationalizing the Tenure Code will be put on the agenda for the January meeting. Invite past chairs to talk about previous CIP efforts on this topic.
- Generation Study Abroad
  - CIP members should reach out to their IOC counterparts to collaborate on their college's efforts towards reaching Generation Study Abroad Goals. Seth Parrish will present study abroad data to IOC next week.
