## IV. Establishing Goals for 2014-14

We can apply the Think & Do theme of the university to this committee while establishing this year's goals. Members broke into small group discussions to talk about goals for the year. Small groups report the following proposed goals:

- Lack of global perspectives (ex. languages, metric system, awarding faculty)
- Study Abroad increase participation and in-depth experiences
- International sabbaticals
- Increase seed grants and funding
- International academic calendars synchronization with overseas partners
- Encourage national awards for international engagement (Churchill/Rhodes)
- Costa Rica example of a strategic partner where a large group of faculty is involved with research, programs, etc. but may not be connected or aware of potential collaborations across departments and curriculum
  - 100K Strong in the Americas initiative NC State awarded grant funding to enhance partnership in Costa Rica (deadline for spring participation is Sept. 12th and is very affordable. Let your students know to apply through Study Abroad)
- College inventories
- Look at the University Strategic Plan, specifically the goal to build global partnerships
- Generation Study Abroad
- Curriculum Integration
- Graduate student recruitment for international students

Rob & Rudi will discuss these goals before the next meeting to set a clear agenda for the year. It was noted that this committee also coordinates the Internationalization Seed Grant process as well as the Jackson Rigney Award. The next meeting is a joint meeting with the International Operations Council (IOC) in Talley where we will be looking at the Generation Study Abroad initiative more closely.
