RECOMMENDATIONS

Because implementation of the Open Meetings Law has made it impractical for the committee to work in subcommittees, there were no subcommittees this year, hence no subcommittee recommendations to include in this report.

Recommendations out of the whole committee include:

- Revising the university's scholarly leave policy to encourage global engagement (we have worked on a <u>draft proposal</u>, to be revised and submitted next year to the Faculty Senate, for consideration)
- Establishing an "Academy of Globally-Engaged Scholars" through the Office of Global Engagement
- Starting with the 2018-19 academic year, limiting each college or administrative unit to only one nomination for the Jackson Rigney Outstanding Career Award (motion approved at April 26, 2018 meeting).
