Provost's Office. The questions are open-ended, and include coverage of research, student recruitment, and student mobility. A summary of the feedback will be presented at the April CIP meeting and will serve as the basis for proposals by the Asia Strategy task force. The goal is to be more strategic, intentional, and inclusive. Michael Bustle is available to provide additional details.

7. Proposed Early Career track for Outstanding Global Engagement Award Ingrid Schmidt sought input from the CIP committee on changes to the selection criteria for a new early career faculty track for the Outstanding Global Engagement Award. This award can change the career trajectory for junior faculty. The award would be announced in the fall, with an application deadline in January.

Feedback from the group was to consider award nominations for those at the assistant professor level (which is the norm in CHASS and some other colleges), or no more than 8-10 years after award of the PhD, keeping in mind that some faculty may be coming from industry. Questions were raised about whether to include post docs or contract scholars, and whether candidates would need to have been at NC State a particular number of years. The feedback from the CIP will be forwarded to the International Operations Council.
