## **SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION ITEMS/ACTIVITIES OF COMMITTEE**

During the 2018-2019 academic year, the CIP discussed the following

- Strategic regional initiatives: reported on initiatives and goals in the colleges, to help inform the work of the Office of Global Engagement.
- Academy of Excellence in Global Engagement: held discussion to help shape a new program to recognize distinguished globally active faculty.
- Reviewed the committee's 2017-18 draft proposal of university's scholarly leave policy to encourage global engagement. Led by the work of a smaller group of committee members, revised it to "the proposal on International Professional Development for North Carolina State University Faculty."
- Food, housing, and financial security for international students: reviewed the results of a GSA study, and considered issuing a public statement or endorsement of recommendations.
- Global logistics portal: contributed feedback and FAQs to this pilot project.
- Office of International Services: gained familiarity with programs and trends, and how faculty can enhance support for international students.
- Study abroad: considered ways to enhance collaboration with the Study Abroad Office, to help meet college internationalization goals and increase global academic opportunities for students.
- NC State European Center in Prague: learned about new developments, and considered opportunities for more faculty to engage.
- International internships: considered a variety of models, and which could be a best fit in various disciplines.
- Global Health Minor: discussed new Global Health Minor and its implications.
- Successful stories of international seed grants: launched an initiative to collect more data and stories from past recipients, to provide better information to future applicants.

- Internationalization seed grant review: scored and recommended list of recipients; considered possible changes to criteria for next year
- Jackson Rigney Award: reviewed nominations, ranked, and recommended final selection to Senior Vice Provost.
- Sponsored students new support initiatives: learned about this new program, and how it will help boost international student enrollments for NC State.
- Asia Strategy Survey: responded to campus-wide survey, and gave feedback on preliminary results
