1. Baden-Württemberg/North Carolina Faculty Mobility Program - Due October 15

If you have colleagues in Germany you'd like to visit to develop a line of inquiry, explore a Study Abroad opportunity, or engage with your German counterpart(s) for a COIL/virtual exchange curriculum development project, this is an ideal grant for those purposes.

- 2. Two opportunities through CAORC (Council of American Overseas Research Centers)
- a. CAORC Multi-Country Research Fellowship Due December 6th 2023

The Multi-Country Research Fellowship enables US scholars to carry out trans-regional and comparative research in countries across the network of Overseas Research Centers as well as other countries. The fellowship supports advanced research in the humanities, social sciences, and allied natural sciences for US doctoral candidates, who are 'all but dissertation' and scholars who have earned their PhD or a terminal degree. Applicants are eligible to apply as individuals or as teams. Scholars must carry out research in two or more countries outside the US, at least one of which must host a participating Overseas Research Center. Twelve awards of \$12,600 each will be granted. Funding is provided by the US Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Each year the highest ranking Multi-Country Fellowship applicant will receive an additional \$1,000 toward travel expenses through the Mary Ellen Lane Multi-Country Travel Award. The award is named after CAORC's founding director, Dr. Mary Ellen Lane.

b. For Humanities Scholars only - CAORC-NEH Research Fellowship - Due January 24, 2024

The CAORC - National Endowment for the Humanities Research Fellowship provides the opportunity for scholars to spend significant time in one country with an Overseas Research Center as a base. The fellowship supports advanced research in the humanities for scholars who hold a PhD or a terminal degree. Applicants must be US citizens or foreign national scholars who have been resident in the US for at least three years. Approximately four awards will be granted and fellowship stipends are \$5,000 per month for four to six consecutive months. This program is funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) under the Fellowship Programs at Independent Research Institutions (FPIRI).
