November 2015 ClarkNexsen hired to prepare Feasibility Study




D. H. Hill Stacks Renovation Project

Scope (November 2016) August 2017

- Renovation of second floor, North Stacks, for DASA use. Highest Priority.
- Renovation of second floor, South Stacks, for Libraries use. Now includes more space for DASA.
- Renovation of third floor, North and South Stacks, for Libraries use. Scope depends on funding.
- New open stair connecting Ask Us with second and third floors of the stacks. High Priority.
- Partial renovation of three existing enclosed stairwells. Low Priority.
- Improvements to north stack elevators. Low Priority.
- All new finishes, HVAC, lighting, power/data infrastructure. High Priority.
- Renovated and enlarged toilets on second and third floors. High Priority.
- Relocation of Visualization Studio (currently in South Stacks, second floor). High Priority.
- Relocation of group study rooms adjacent to south stacks elevators on second and third floors.



Second Floor Plan



Third Floor Plan










