Perpetual Access to Electronic Content

- Portico
 - Est. 2002, e-journals, e-books, conf proceedings
- LOCKSS (Lots of Copies Keeps Stuff Safe)
 - Est. 1999; locally installed “LOCKSS box”, backed by Global LOCKSS Network
- Publishers commit to long-term preservation; libraries join as members
- When publisher’s website unavailable, access reverts to one of the above
- Many publishers also provide post-cancellation access on their website

43,647 journal titles

Collaboration with Shared Print Programs

- TRLN Cooperative Print Retention Working Group
 - Serials since 2008, Books since 2018
- HathiTrust Shared Print Retention Program
 - Established in 2016, NC State Univ Libraries participants since Spring 2018
 - 18M books, 79+ libraries
- ASERL Scholars' Trust Journal Retention Program
 - Established in 2008
 - 44,000 journals, 50+ libraries
- ASERL Centers of Excellence
 - 39 libraries, NC State Univ responsible for:
 - Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) documents
 - NC Soil Surveys
- Federal Depository Library Program & Patent Depository
 - Government documents

More than 46M retention commitments across 300 libraries and 16 shared print programs

Shared Print Retention Programs

- A Shared Print Retention Program is:
 - An organized and formal structure to explicitly retain particular volumes distributed among member libraries. All members execute an MOU and agree to terms, conditions, and workflows.
 - All shared print programs include the formal provision that retained volumes are to be available to all members.
- Shared vision:
 - Ensure the long-term preservation, accessibility and integrity of monographic print resources.
- Shared mission:
 - Coordinate collaboration among shared print monograph initiatives and collections in North America to support cost-effective retention and access to shared print monograph collections.

- Aligned Circulation Policies (where possible)
- Commitments to Retain
- Rapid Resource Sharing
- Specialized Local Collections
- Coordinated Completeness
