 - Last spring was the first time we returned to pre-pandemic levels
 - This fall's in-building traffic continues to increase
 - Student wellness focus in the Libraries and across campus
 - Student success and affordability continue to be a focus
 - New esports pilot facility in the Hunt Library to open in Januaryu
 - Enrollment increase more students are here and planned to come in the next few years, but we are awaiting the accompanying funding, pending the state budget and university-level allocations

2. <u>Public Access to Federally Funded Research and Data</u> - Overview and Libraries Support - Susan Ivey, Director, Research Facilitation Service; Hilary Davis, Department Head, Collections & Research Strategy

- Nelson Memo
 - Federal agencies and departments to update public access policy or create one
 - No embargo period
 - No-cost access to publications and underlying data for publications
 - Publications are being expanded to peer-reviewed book chapters, editorials, and conference proceedings
 - Final public access policies are due in December 2024, to take effect in December 2025

- Libraries support for data
 - Dryad Data Repository Libraries has a membership
 - Research Data Management Guide web-based guide for researchers
 - DMPTool
 - Research Facilitation Service
- Libraries support for publications
 - Open Knowledge Center
 - Open Access agreements
 - Libraries agreements with publishers for cost coverage for open access publishing
 - Guidance for existing article repositories
- Libraries support for metadata and identifiers
 - ORCiD can transfer with you across universities
 - Citation Index Collection of citations to publications by NC State-affiliated authors
 - Connects ORCID with university ID
 - Libraries CV Service
 - Register ORCiD with the Libraries
 - Send CV with a short upload form
 - The Libraries fills in the gaps and sends works with DOIs to ORCiD for you
 - Dryad membership
 - Consultation for identifying other DOI-issuing data repositories
 - CrossRef membership
- NSF's fillable biosketch PDF to be discontinued after Oct. 23; researchers should use

SciENcv and ORCID to create their biosketches.

• A member noted that using these tools provides an alternative to relying on <u>Google</u> <u>Scholar Citations</u> to provide bibliometric data.

- Space within our buildings for our services and programs continues to be a challenge
- Brickyard renovation Integrative Sciences Building first, then Brickyard renovation
- Quiet study in the Libraries is the primary driver for students interviewed
- Students would like to keep the variety of spaces the Libraries offers
- Hill renovation physical drivers: loading dock utility/safety; internal connectivity; Brickyard connectivity; dining experience and capacity
- Reviewed primary renderings
- These changes would take place 20-25 years from now, if funded
