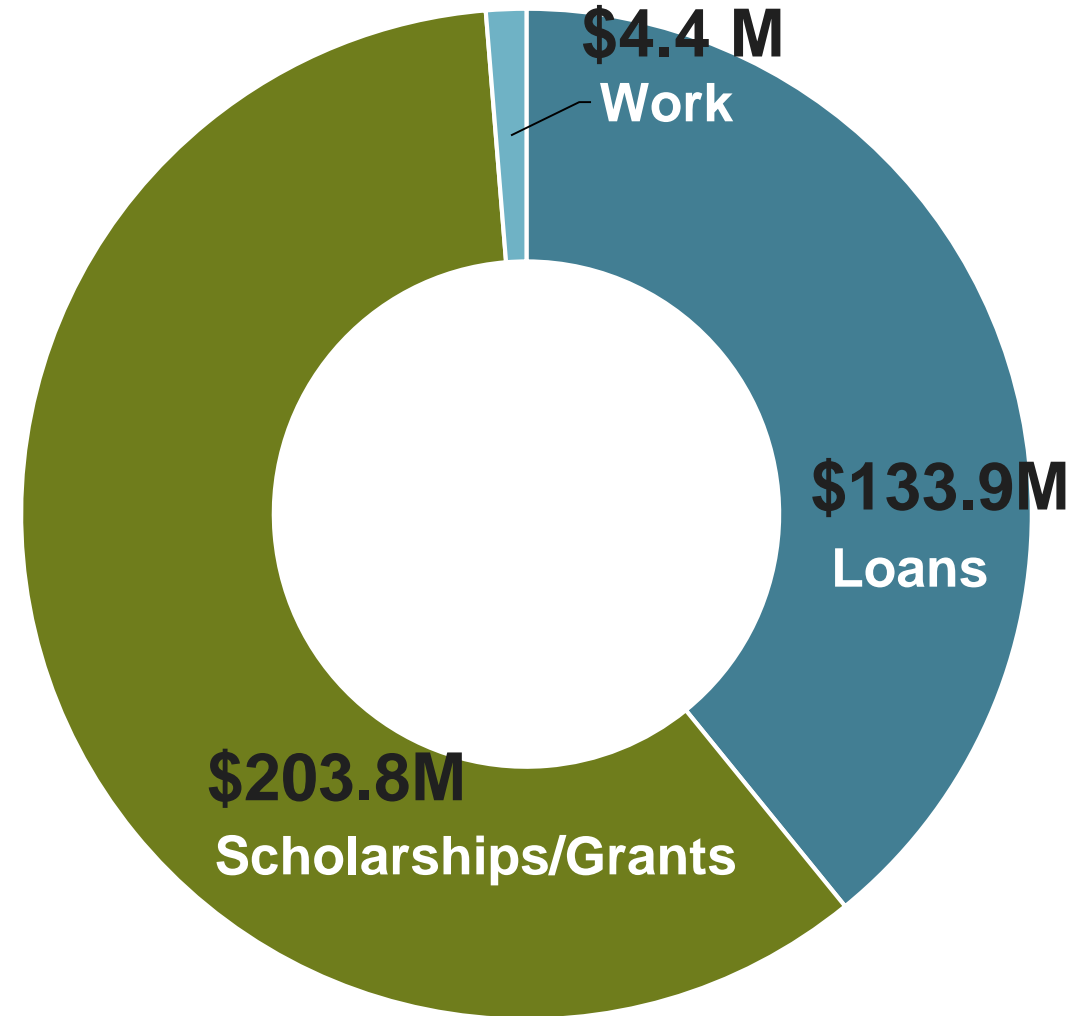

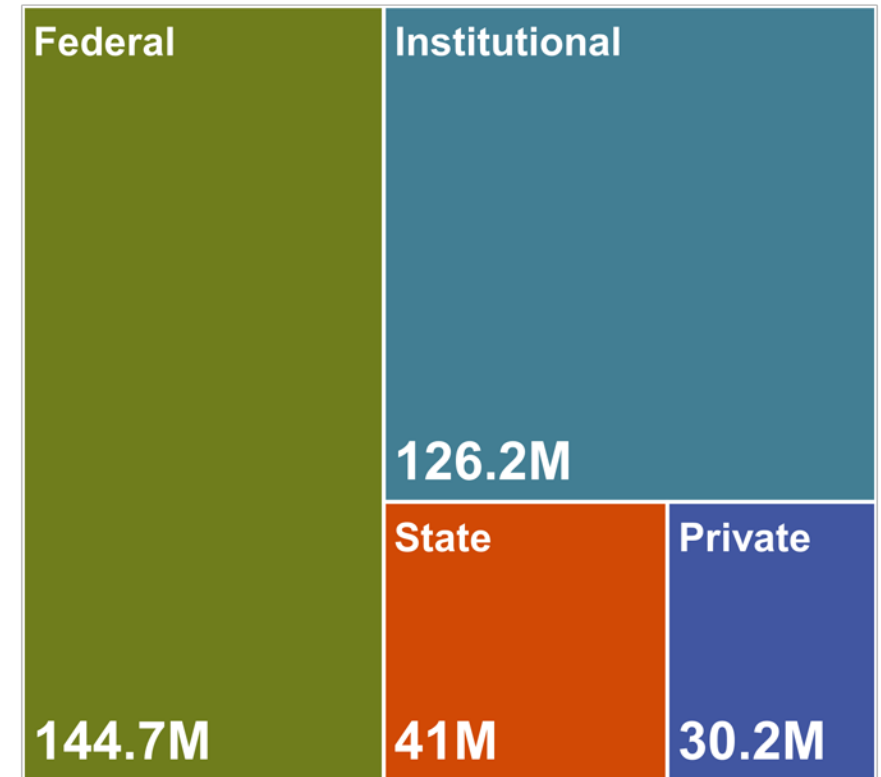

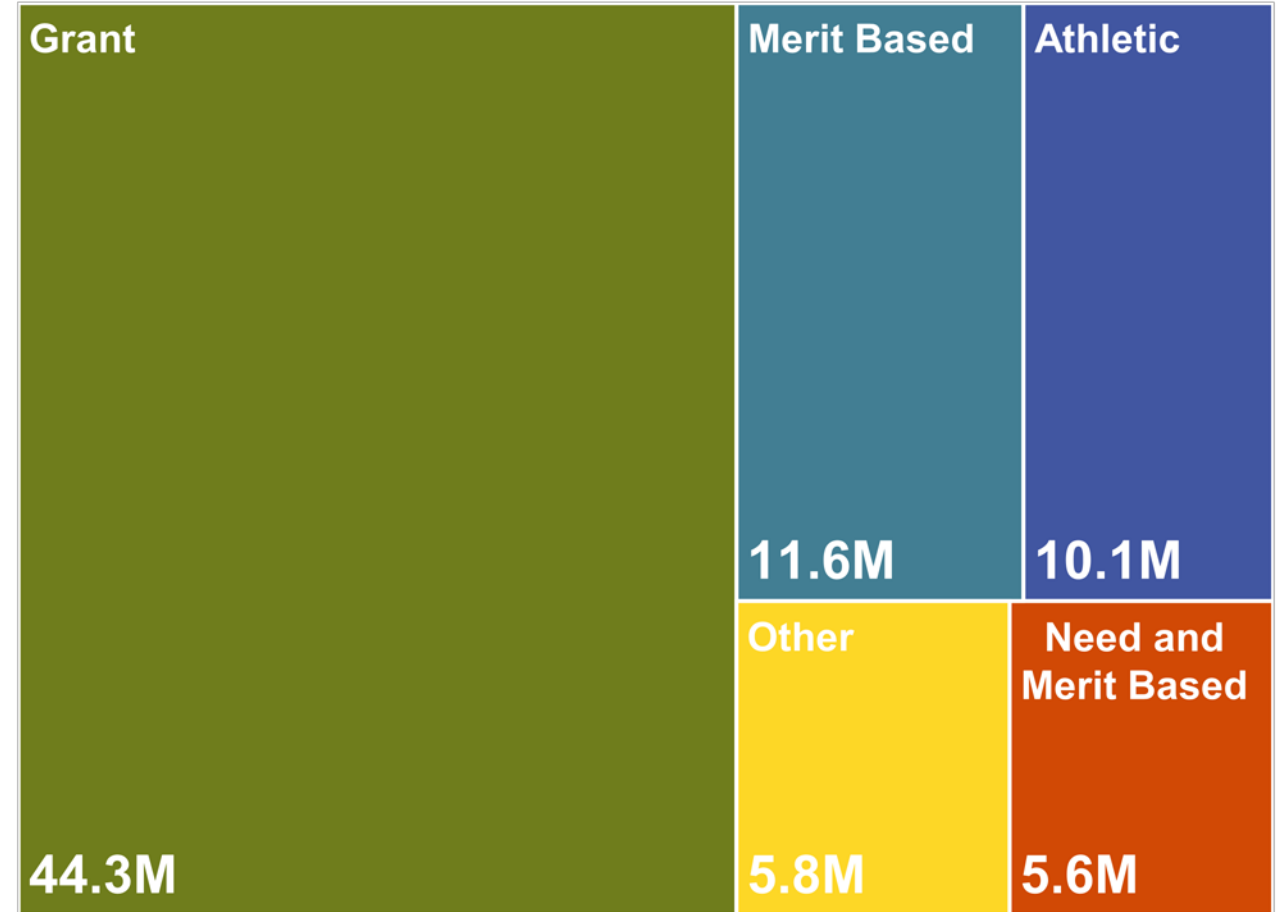

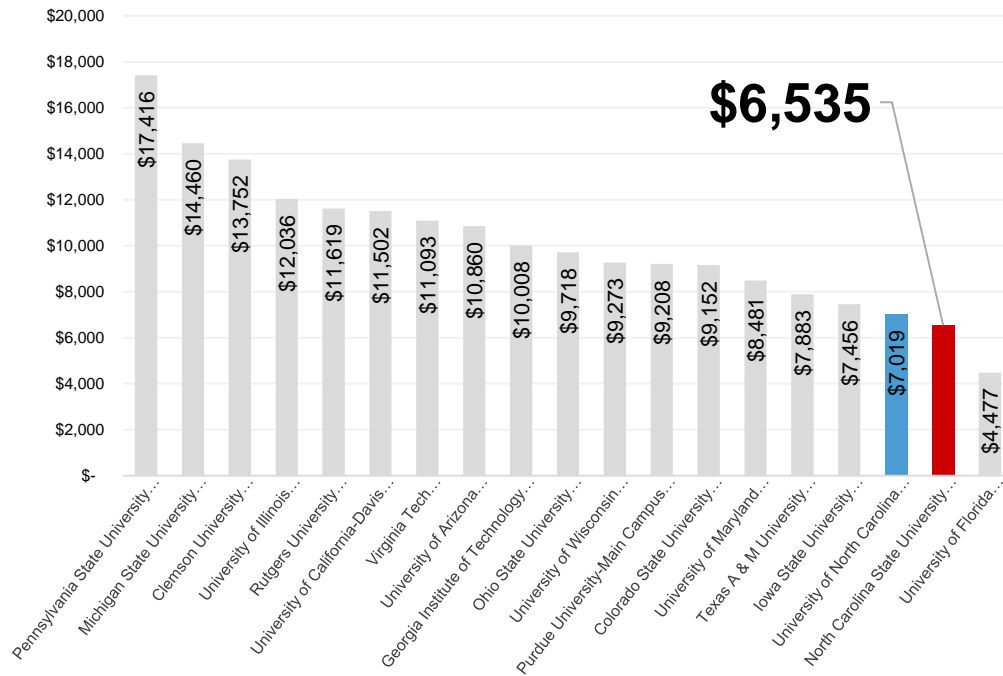

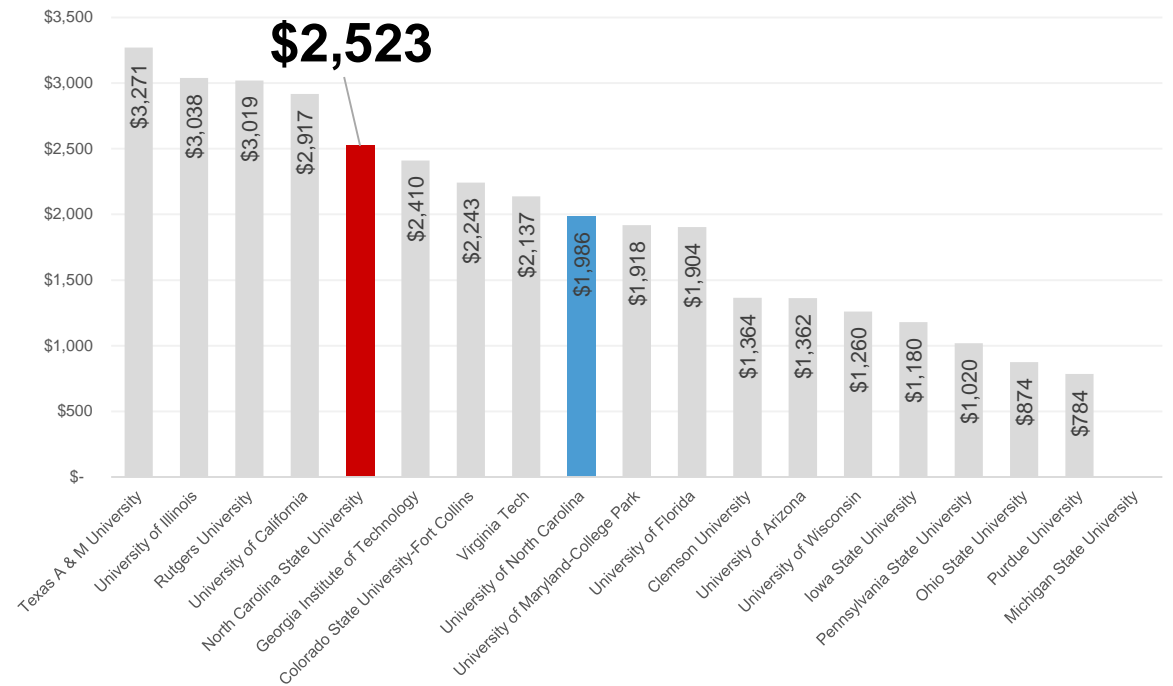
In-State Tuition

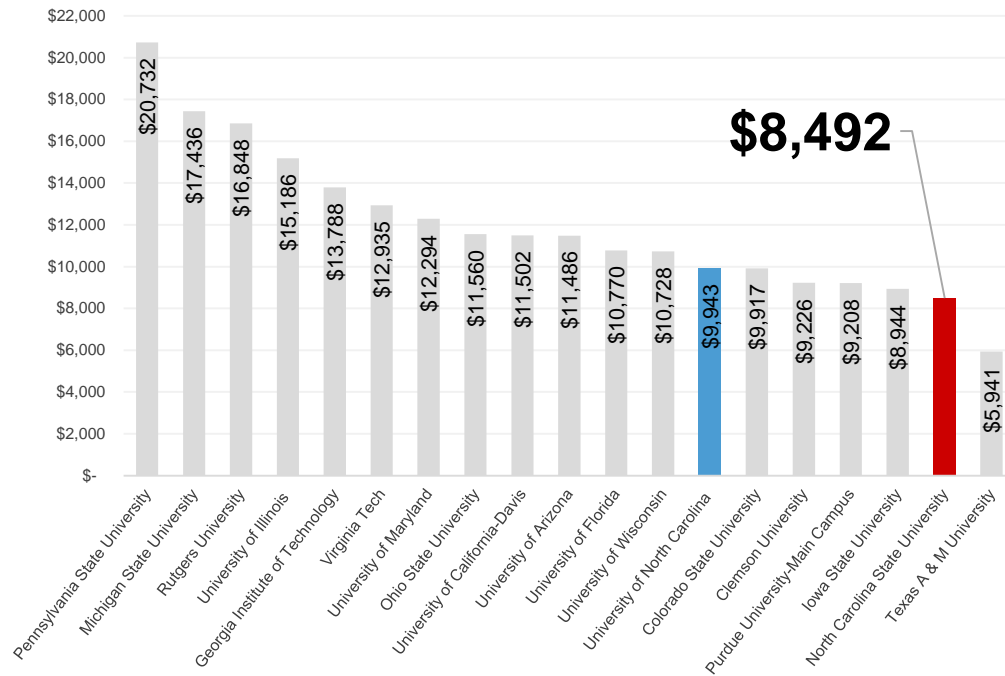

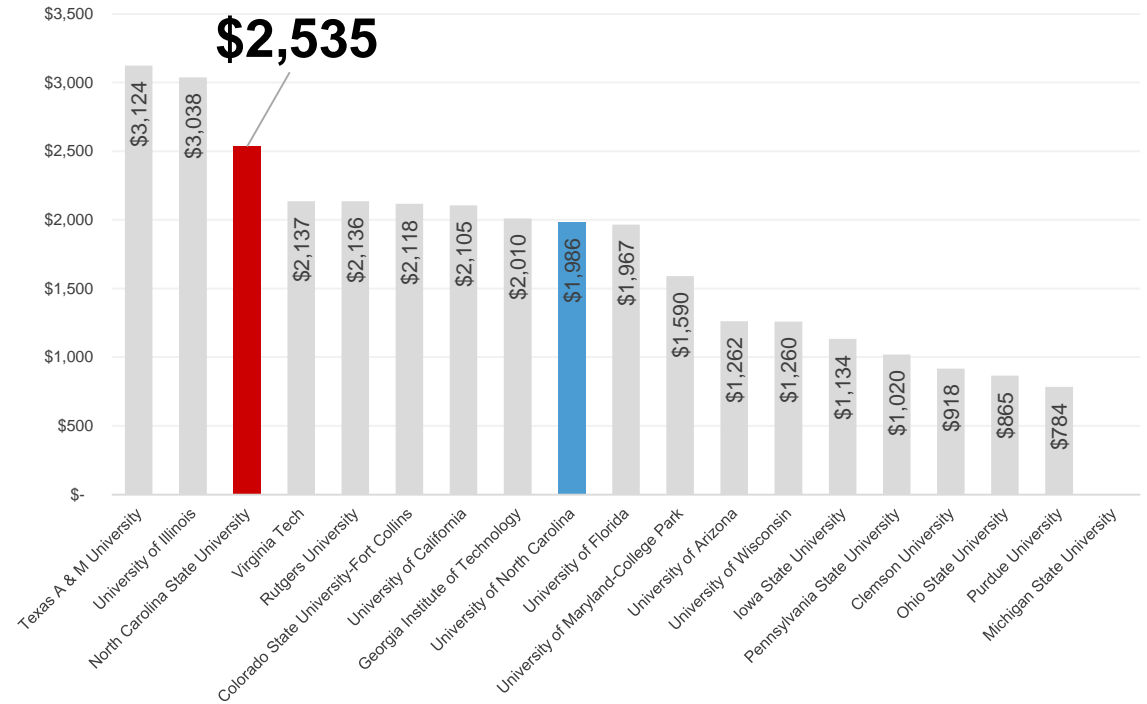

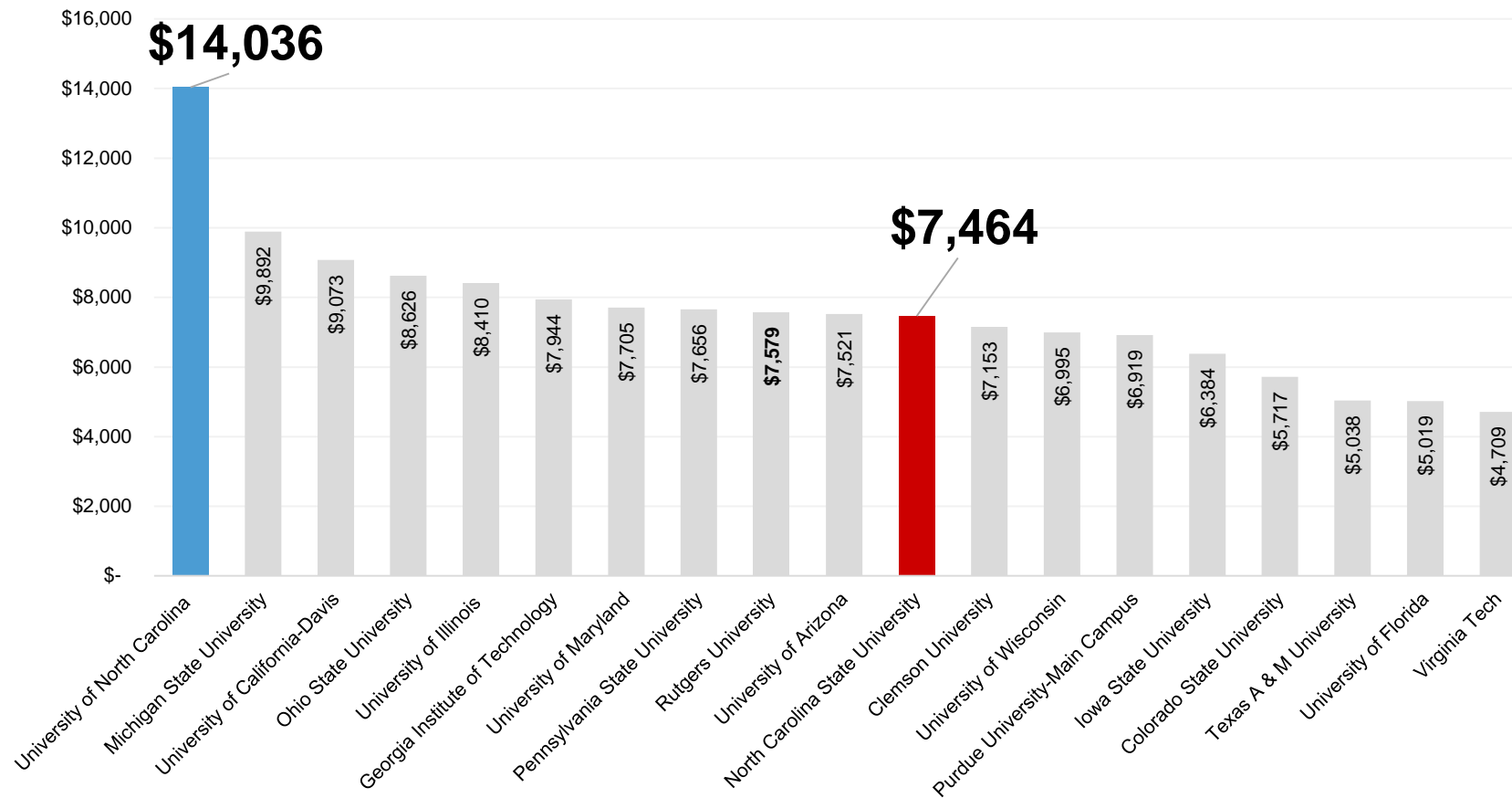

Cost of Attendance (Variable)

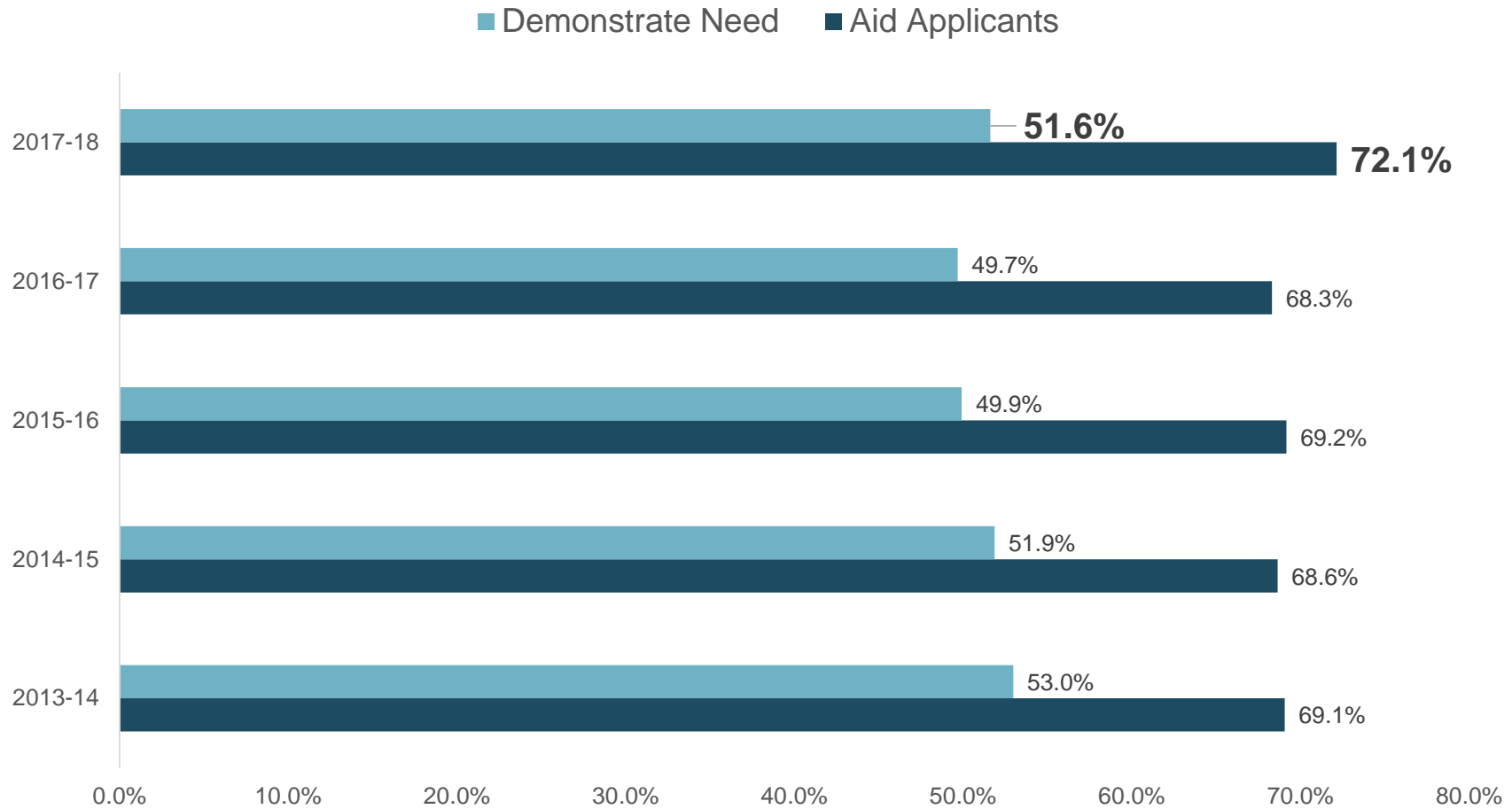

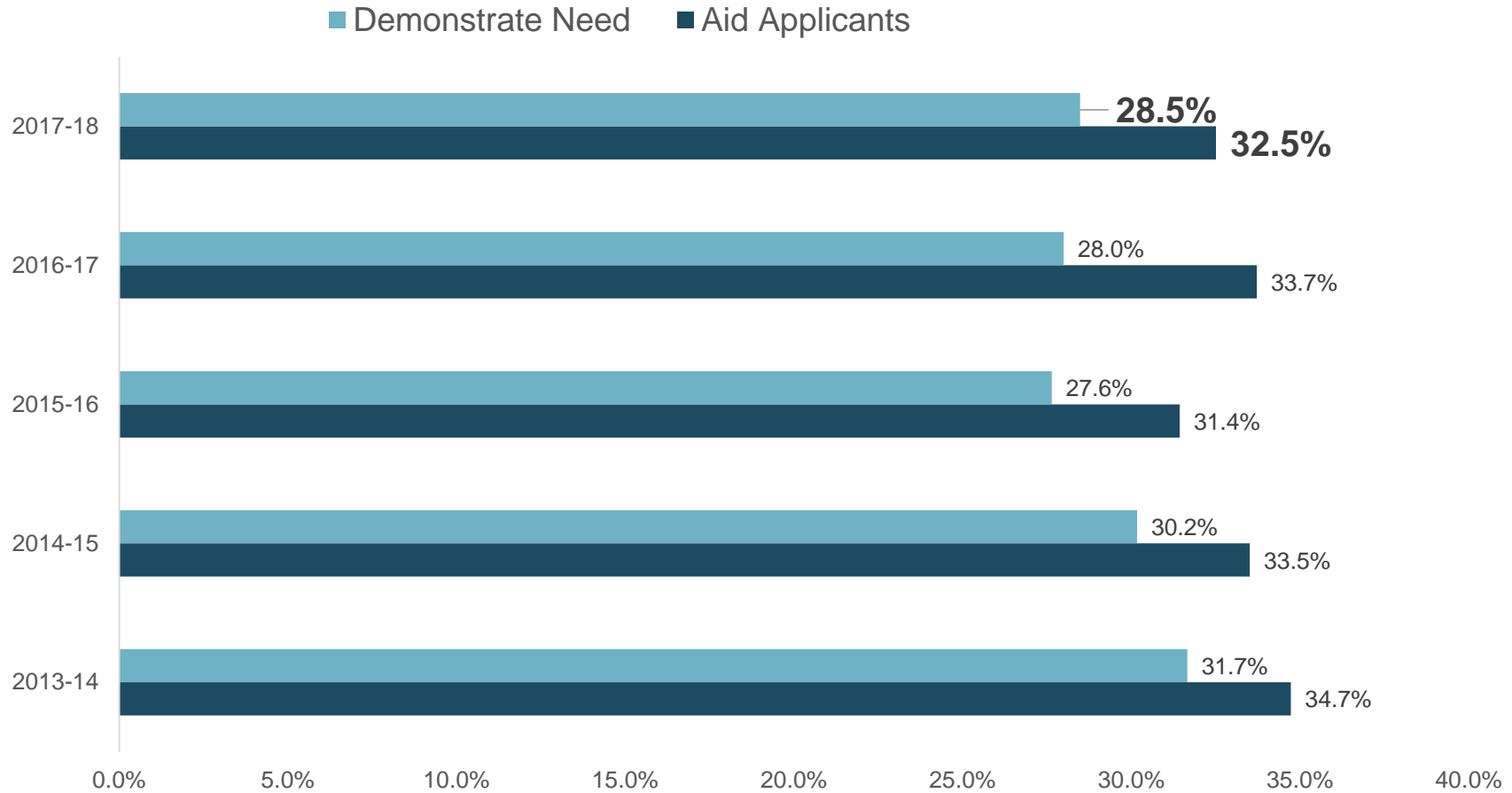

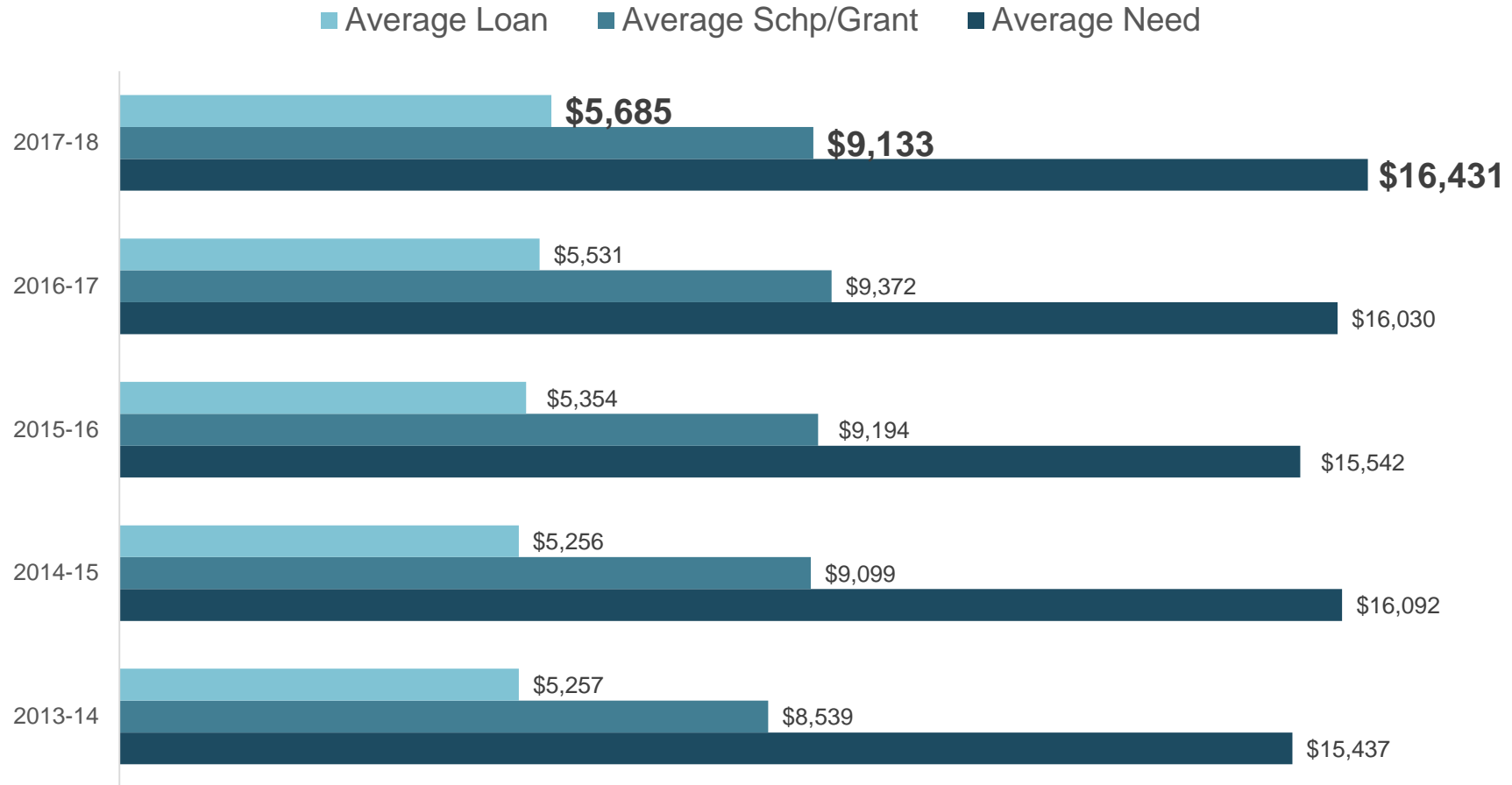

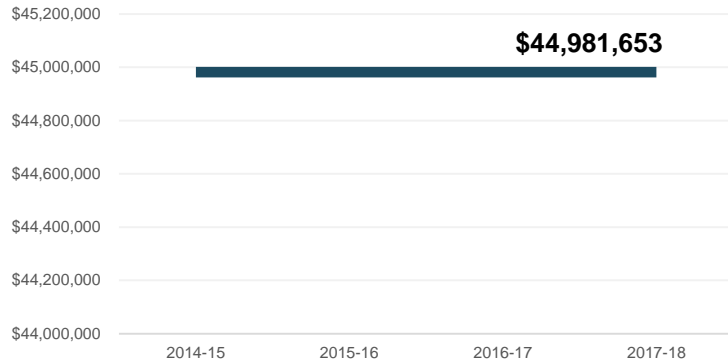
AVERAGE NEED VERSUS SCHOLARSHIPS/GRANTS AND LOANS RECEIVED (UGRD)



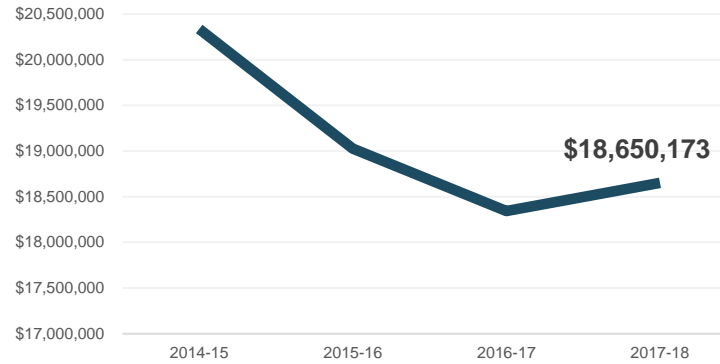

TOTAL CITI AID, TOTAL STATE AID, AND COST OF ATTENDANCE

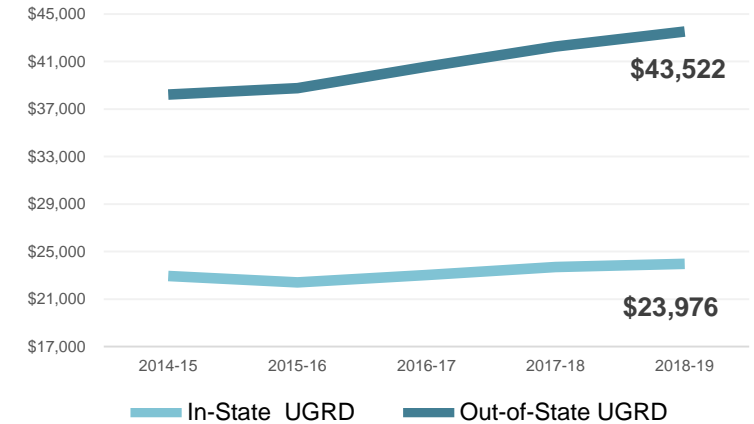
Total CITI Allocation



Total State Aid (UGRD)

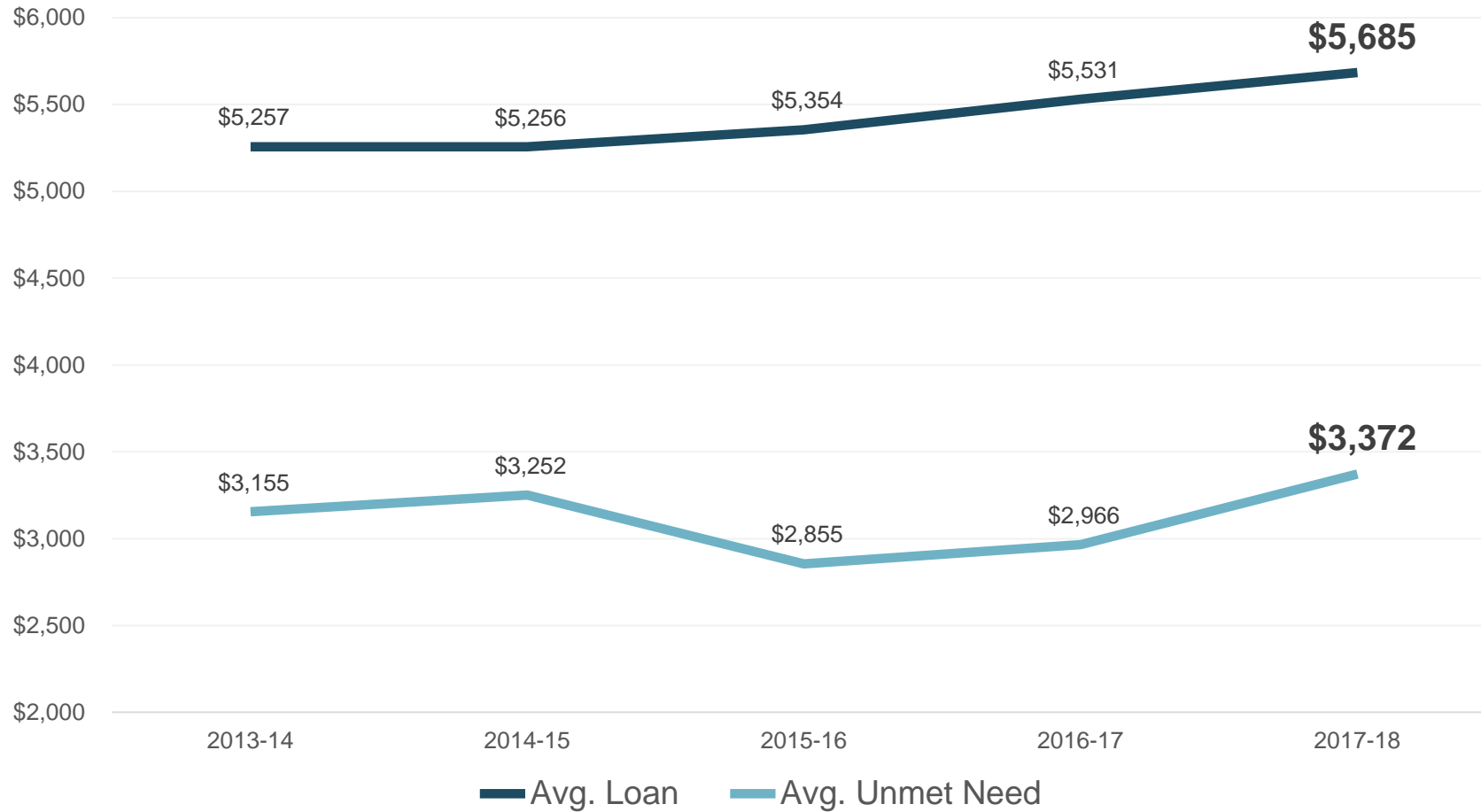


Cost of Attendance

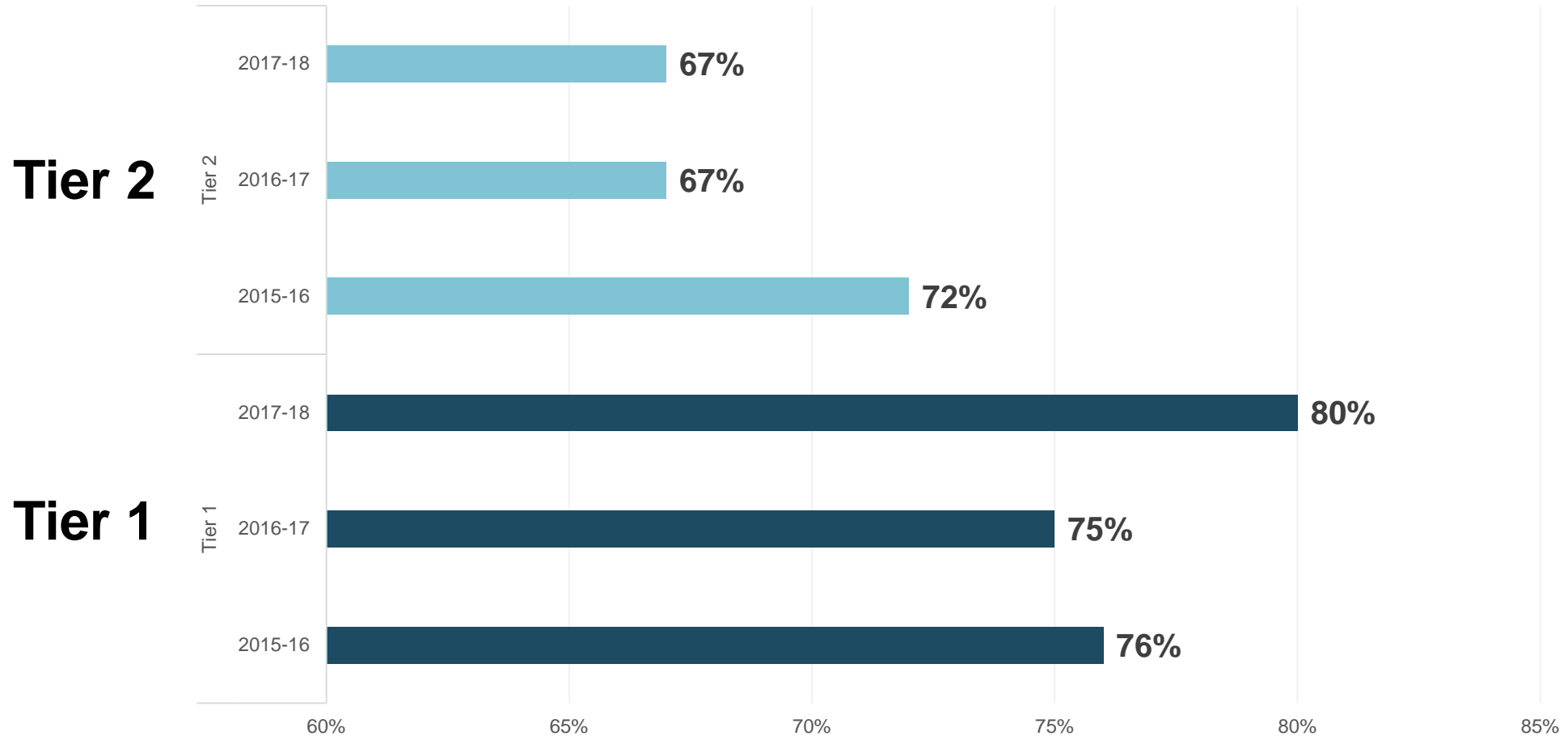
