NEW BUSINESS

<u>Consent Agenda</u> – <u>Approved</u> Discussion: The consent agenda was approved.

Courses New to GEP

FS 221 : Discover: Chocolate, Coffee and Tea (NS) – Approved Discussion: This new course was presented by Jordan who introduced guest Fernanda Santos.

HI 447 / HI 547 / WGS 447 / WGS 547 : Women in America to 1890 (USDEI) – Approved with suggestions
Discussion: This course was presented by Reaser. Suggestion on the learning objective "Analyze what makes women's experience different from men." Asking if the "what" could be a bit more specific about what subjects will be covered. Member asked if this would discuss all women, enslaved, indigenous, and white women, or only white colonial women. The measure of the third outcome answered that all women will be studied. Analyze the impact of race, class, culture of women and how this experience was different from men. The learning outcome for the overall course "Explain how political economic legal and social realities have shaped women's

outcome for the overall course "Explain how political, economic, legal, and social realities have shaped women's identities based on their race/ethnicity, class, gender, sexuality, region, religion, disability and/or age.", member suggested the following outcome for objective one "Analyze how political, economic, legal, and social realities have shaped women's experiences and made them distinct from men's experiences in America."

Discussion : Chair Elect Nominations open until 29 September. -Chair set this as a goal deadline to select a chair elect. <u>Suggested Practices Documentation</u> (No GEP changes) Li introduced the suggested practices document as a place to ask questions such as courses with no GEP changes skipping CUE in the workflow. The membership decided a notification would be sufficient and not need to wait at the meeting step before moving to UCCC. Li explained the how the admin save memo is more broad than this type of adjustment and asked the committee to consider this and vote at the next meeting.
