- I. Introductions and discussion of dates for spring semester meeting. Spring Semester meeting agenda will include a discussion of identifying a chair for the coming academic year.

Susan also proposes postponing the item about re-organization as she will have more information in the spring. Other future agenda items that arise during the conversation that follows include new policy around therapy and assistance animals; an emerging residential curriculum for all first-year students; and the Lee Hall visitation policy.

Susan provides an overview of the types of University Housing including a discussion on the Living and Learning Villages. There's also much discussion of intersession and holiday closures. The point is made that student may not want to go home during breaks but also not be able to afford the additional cost.

- II. Susan shares more information about fall 2017 on-campus requirement  
Stacey mentions that she hasn't had much reaction as she recruits to the on-campus requirement. Raymond is interested in learning more about how we plan to engage with first-year students as we go through this transition, and Susan agrees that this will be a good part of the discussion at the spring meeting about the residential curriculum for first-year students that is being developed. Susan shows a report titled, "Fall 2012 Cohort Information" that compare measures of academic success with on- and off-campus living situations. Susan and Rob will send this report out to the group.

University Housing has partnered with RoomSync, a roommate matching application run via Facebook. Students (current NC State students or prospective new entries to NC State) create a page sharing only those personal interests that they feel comfortable sharing. Other NC State students looking for a roommate can search the site to see if they can find a match.

At this point, gender-inclusive housing is not a practice at state institutions in NC.
