RECOMMENDATIONS

The committee did not make any formal recommendations during the 2024–2025 academic year. However, key discussion points may inform future directions for university housing enhancements.

SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION ITEMS/ACTIVITIES OF COMMITTEE

The University Housing Advisory Committee met three times during the academic year, with a focus on understanding operational priorities, reviewing housing infrastructure updates, and addressing evolving residential needs tied to rising enrollment. Below is a summary of the committee's primary activities:

September 27, 2024 (Zoom)

- Reviewed committee roles and responsibilities, emphasizing the importance of aligning housing policy with student success and academic mission.
- Encouraged open topic generation for future meetings.
- No specific proposals or additional business were raised.

November 8, 2024 (In-Person, Quad Commons)

- Discussed the recent acquisition of University Towers, increasing bed capacity to over 10,300.
- Reviewed proposed housing rate increase of 4.24% due to rising utilities and ongoing renovations.
- Received updates on sustainability efforts, including bottle-filling stations across residence halls.
- Participated in a housing facility tour, showcasing upgrades and student living enhancements.
- Engaged in a detailed conversation on:
 - Residential student experience and well-being
 - Operational responsiveness (average 16-hour work order resolution)
 - Capital improvements: HVAC, accessibility, and fire safety systems
 - Budget planning and long-term financial sustainability

April 8, 2025 (Zoom)

- Received major updates from University Housing leadership, including:
 - Phase 2 renovations for University Towers, including HVAC and common space improvements
 - Wood Hall HVAC conversion and green space enhancements
 - Tree removal and repurposing at Wolf Village
 - Fall 2025 housing demand and waitlist projections
 - Village program updates (e.g., EcoVillage, SAVE Village 20th anniversary)
 - Introduction of Elevate Program to support students with intellectual disabilities
 - Impact of increasing university enrollment on housing capacity
- Announced the upcoming election of a new committee chair (Chair-Elect: Connor Brady)

The committee expressed strong appreciation for the University Housing team's continued innovation, responsiveness, and commitment to student success.
